Is it for me?

Bridging Brown County is for everyone! Bridging Brown County is a 501(c) (3) non-profit formed in 2000 and incorporated in 2003 to discuss ideas to develop greater awareness of **community throughout our county**.

Many of us think of our "community" as only the town in which we live. But we also belong to a larger rural community: the community formed by all residents of Brown County. We are a **neighborhood of communities** that share common challenges and opportunities.

Directors must want to improve the quality of life of Brown County Minnesota residents by completing economic and community development projects. Bridging Brown County seeks to have diverse Directors to represent the four geographical regions of Brown County Minnesota.

What do I do as a Director?

1. Attend Regular Board meetings (12 times/year) and other meetings as necessary.
2. Represent your community.
3. Commit time and resources to BBC projects—volunteer for BBC projects and attend BBC sponsored events throughout the year.
4. Assist BBC to create and follow an Annual Plan of Work and Area Plan.
5. Provide fiscal management and ensure legal requirements are met.
6. Assist BBC to raise funds for programs and projects.
7. Monitor and manage BBC programs and projects and be informed

What are a Director's responsibilities?

- Duty of Care— act in a way that an ordinarily prudent person would act in a like position and under similar circumstances
- Duty of Obedience— act lawfully to further the purpose of the organization
- Duty of Loyalty—faithfully pursue the interests of the organization instead of self-interests

How do I become a BBC Director?

BBC Directors are nominated and elected by the BBC Board of Directors each year. Directors may any citizen of Brown County appointed by the nominating committee. Three Directors from each of four geographical regions in Brown County make up the Board.
